



Ministry in the Methodist Tradition

NOW AVAILABLE AS AN ONSITE INTENSIVE SHORT SUMMER SCHOOL

This short summer school offers an intensive onsite version of Ministry in the Methodist Tradition. Join together with others exploring the development of ministries in Methodism, and the characteristics of Methodist ministry today. This unit is part of the Local Lay-Pastor training, as well as being an inspiring refresher for those engaging in a variety of roles in the Methodist Church.

If you are currently doing LLP training via Cliff, you can choose to take the Ministry in the Methodist Tradition unit via this intensive short course, rather than online weekly from April. If you have already pre-paid your course fee for this unit, you will simply need to pay the residential version charge of £200.

Those undertaking this unit for credit will need to submit two main pieces of assessment following the summer school. The first is an 800 word church magazine/blog style article, discussing a form of ministry in the Methodist tradition (such as an explanation of the role of Local Lay-Pastor, or local preacher, or church steward). The second is a 10 minute recorded presentation, discussing what is characteristically Methodist about ministry.

It is possible to 'audit' this summer school, meaning that you do not need to submit any work for assessment. However, this option only applies if you do not need the credit for any training pathway purposes.

Deadline for applications for the summer school: Friday 13th June. If you have already signed up for the weekly online version, but wish to switch to the onsite version, you need to let us know by 31st March at the latest. Email enquiries@cliffcollege.ac.uk for more information.
