
New Places for New People (NPNP)/ Church at the Margins Update July/August 2024


Faith-Rooted Community Organising



Title of the Research: A Critical exploration of the theological foundations of disability inclusion within Pioneer ministry and Fresh Expressions of Church.

What is the aim of the research?: The aim of the research is to determine to what extent Theology, or Theologies, of Disability is being integrated into the foundational theology of Fresh Expressions and pioneer ministry with a view to better inclusion in such ministries.
