They gave away over 4,000 food parcels.

Fun facts about the Pacific Islands!

- There are about 30,000 islands in the Pacific Ocean, and people live on only 2.000 of them.
- The Pacific Islands were made by volcanoes exploding or formed on top of coral reefs. The islands made by volcanoes are bigger, and more people can live on them. The islands made on coral reefs are smaller, and fewer people can live on them.
- The Pacific Islands are split into three different regions: Melanesia, Micronesia and Polynesia
- Tonga, a Pacific Island nation, is a kingdom with a royal family. Queen Nanasipau'u and King Tupou VI of Tonga attended the coronation of King Charles III and Queen Camilla last year.

The Methodist Church in the Pacific Islands

The Methodist Church in Britain works with a number of partner churches in the Pacific:

- > United Church in Papua New Guinea
- > The United Church in the Solomon Islands
- > Methodist Church in Fiji
- > Methodist Church in Samoa
- > Free Wesleyan Church of Tonga

There are many Methodist people on the Pacific Islands. In Fiji over 30 per cent of the population are Methodists, and in Tonga this rises to over 70 per cent.

There are lots of Methodists from the Pacific, or with a heritage from the Pacific, living in Britain. They play a big part in the life of the Methodist Church in Britain.
