### **Urgent Notice - Please Read**

The following is a message from the **Historic Religious Buildings Alliance** and relates to the **Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme (VAT)** 



Dear Colleagues,

We're writing about the government's VAT grant scheme. This gives grants covering the VAT on repairs or alterations over £1000 to a listed place of worship. The official name of the scheme is the **Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme**.

#### The Scheme is currently set to run only until the end of March 2025.

As you will know from media reports, the government is looking very carefully at its patterns of expenditure in the run up to the late October budget. We therefore think it would be sensible to confirm to the government how important and valued this grant scheme is, and ask them to continue it.



#### HSE Campaign on the Risk of Asbestos

Asbestos remains in millions of homes and buildings today and it can become dangerous

when disturbed or damaged. HSE is currently running 2 asbestos campaigns to highlight the risks of having and/or dealing with Asbestos:

**Asbestos and You** - This campaign is more for tradesperson and it highlights the risks they need to watch out for especially when carrying out building works on buildings built before 2000. Click <u>here</u> to access the resources for the 'Asbestos and You' campaign.



Asbestos – Your Duty - This campaign raises awareness of the legal <u>duty to</u> <u>manage asbestos</u> in buildings. The HSE website guidelines include information on

- what the legal duty is, and steps required to comply with the law
- who the duty holder is (depending on the type of building) and what they must do
- new templates of an asbestos management plan and asbestos register
- examples of how asbestos can be managed etc.

#### **Resilient Rainwater Systems**

Rainwater systems collect and/or direct rainwater away from buildings. They comprise



rainwater shedding details (such as projecting eaves); rainwater goods (eaves, valley, box or parapet gutters; outlets; hoppers and downpipes); gullies and below ground drains.

Rainwater systems are essential to keep a building in good condition and prevent its deterioration. If rainwater systems fail and water penetration occurs, this can cause fabric decay, such as timber rot. The increase in winter precipitation, and more frequent intense rainfall events are causing rainwater systems to fail.

This Fund is available for projects that are focused taking ownership of assets that are at risk of loss in a particular community. The Capital funding available is at the tune of up to £2 million of all asset types but the fund expects that most awards will be for up to £250,000 of capital funding.
