Getting to the NCC

The National Conference Centre is centrally situated at J6 on the M42 with excellent transport links to Birmingham International Airport and train station which is just a 5 minute drive away.

Bv Rail

The closest train station is Birmingham International which is just a 5 minute taxi drive. During the Conference, we will provide shuttle buses for representatives to travel to and from the venue.

By Car

Situated on J6 of the M42, follow signs to The National Motorcycle Museum from all approach roads. Postcode B92 0EJ

The venue has free parking spaces on site, including charge points for electric cars and disabled parking.

By Air

Nearest airport is the Birmingham International Airport, which is a 5 minutes taxi drive.

Meals

The Conference provides some meals for representatives. When a meal is not provided, you will be able to reclaim the cost of your meal.

Breakfast is served at your accommodation.

Lunch is provided at the Conference venue every day. No meals are provided in the evening.

Expenses

You may claim up to £8.00 per day for

lunch and a maximum of £22.50 per day for your evening meal. The Conference cannot reimburse the cost of alcohol taken with meals.

The travel allowance to the Conference is either the reimbursement of rail, airline or coach tickets, or 45p per mile by car. If you are bringing other Conference representatives you may claim an additional 5p per mile for each passenger.

For those attending online, we recognise that you may incur expenses, such as increased data or phone costs. Reasonable expenses related to facilitating your participation in the virtual Conference will be reimbursed.

How to claim expenses

All expense claims must be submitted by Friday 23 July. District representatives should submit their claims via their District Treasurer; all other representatives should submit their claims to the Conference Office using the claim form that will be circulated before the Conference.
