The Way of the Cross

The Way of the Cross or Stations of the Cross are a traditional devotional prayer of the church. They are usually prayed by physically moving from one station to the next, our journey recalling Christ's journey to Calvary and ultimately to the tomb. As we walk in his footsteps, we pray and reflect on his sufferings for us. This simple resource aims to let you pray the stations at home, with a printout or on an electronic device.

For each station, read the title of the station, spend some time contemplating the image and then read the reflection and prayers that go with it. Each includes a verse or two of a hymn which you can sing or say. You can pray them all at once or you may like to do two or three at a time and work through them over the days of Holy Week.

1. Jesus is condemned to death
